## 2010-2011 School Year Starts Monday, August 23<sup>rd</sup>

### School Uniform now available at Sunshine Uniforms

We are using the same uniforms as last year. Below are the details for each gender. The shirts and dresses must be purchased at the uniform store; the other pieces can be purchased elsewhere.

#### Boys Wear:

- Light blue polo with school patch on left chest
- Navy blue bottoms, either shorts or pants - NO CARGOS, please.
- Navy blue socks
- Black rubber-soled shoes (black sneakers OK, but must be plain – no characters)

#### Girls Wear:

- Navy Polo dress with school patch on left chest
- Navy blue shorts underneath dress
- White or navy blue socks
- Black "Mary Jane" shoes

All students must also purchase the P.E. t-shirt

- Children ages 5 and up will wear these shirts (with navy gym shorts and sneakers) for P.E. class.
- All students use these shirts on Field Trips

Adherence to the uniform policy is mandatory and strictly enforced. It is also an important lesson for our students – we appreciate you doing your part to help them with this task!

## School Supplies

We provide our students with all the Montessori materials they'll need for their lessons. However, please be prepared to send the following items for your student.

**Toddlers and Pre-Primary students that will nap:**  
(These items will be kept in the classroom)

- fitted crib sheet, small pillow & blanket plus a "comfort" item (stuffed toy, pacifier, etc.)
- extra diapers, wipes, and diaper cream
- a change or two of clothes

**Pre-Primary:**

Your child should bring a backpack each day so that he can take home and bring back any homework assignments or projects. Students will need the following items (that will be kept in the classroom)

- 2 composition notebooks (no wire-bound)
- 2 tablets of story paper
- a reusable water bottle

Students that are ready for workbooks will be provided with their first set at the start of the school year (after teacher assess their level).

Should your child complete a set of books prior to the end of the year, the next level will be purchased for him and the parents' account will be billed accordingly.

**PLEASE LABEL ALL ITEMS WITH YOUR**

**CHILD'S NAME:** Backpacks, lunchboxes, tupperware, sweaters, water bottles and more! It's easy for kids' things to get mixed up and hard for teachers to keep them straight.

## Contributions for the Class:

### Pre-Primary

The items below are things that the teachers use constantly and supply can rarely keep up with demand. We ask that parents contribute to the class at least 1 of the items listed below.

- hand sanitizer
- facial tissues
- ketchup
- paper towels (used in projects)

### Toddlers

These items are used by all students, all the time. Each parent should send the items listed below at the start of the school. As the items run out, a note will be sent home to parents to "refill" the stock pile:

- box of wipies (multi-pack box!)
- diaper cream or Vaseline
- facial tissues
- paper towels (used in projects)
- hand sanitizer
- ketchup (1 bottle)

*Start their day with a healthy breakfast!*



Research shows that kids that start their day with a healthy breakfast rich in fiber have better concentration throughout the school day. In fact, kids should receive most of their daily fiber intake at breakfast! Avoid sugary cereals – your child will get to school all wound up, but then experience a "crash" when it's time to start learning!
